




Education at STEM Magnet Academy

The acronym STEM stands for science, technology, engineering, and math. The STEM curriculum is designed to incorporate the STEM components into all disciplines. STEM education changes the typical teacher-centered classroom by incorporating a curriculum that utilizes problem-solving, discovery, exploratory learning, and requires students to actively engage in a problem in order to find its solution.

CPS Accountability Redesign

For the last two years, the district has engaged stakeholders to redesign its approach to accountability, including school ratings.

- **This new approach will be grounded in the priorities of parents, educators, school leaders, and other key stakeholders**
- **CPS is partnering with an advisory group of stakeholders to formulate recommendations (published at CPSEngagement.com/Accountability-Redesign)**
- **Per an [April 2022 Board resolution](#), the new approach will not include summative scores, but will focus on driving equitable and effective supports to school communities**
- **CPS is targeting April 2023 for a final Board vote on the new accountability policy, and will be publicizing additional opportunities to give your feedback. Stay tuned!**

CPS Accountability Redesign (cont.)

The transition to our new approach to accountability will include the following key milestones:

- **Fall 2022 - third year with no ratings (Level 1+, 1, etc.); accountability statuses (e.g., Good Standing) carry over**
- **Fall 2023 - accountability statuses (which state law requires CPS to publish) are determined using the state's rating system, per [July 2022 resolution](#)**
- **Fall 2024 - first release of information (likely in the form of an [Board](#) updated school dashboard) under the new approach to accountability**






Percent of Students by Performance Level: IAR ELA

Part 3

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2021-2023 CIWP Priorities & Goals

Strategy 1

If we do... Determine focus areas for professional growth based on student data and priority groups; collaboratively develop school-wide tiering criteria and a menu of interventions; provide training for all staff members followed by a review of teacher implementation of Tiers 1-3 interventions quarterly; and provide additional MTSS supports and progress monitoring as needed for students in Tiers 1-3;

then we see.... All staff across all grade levels and subject areas implementing strategies identified by the MTSS team and consistently monitoring student progress;

which leads to... 100% of staff implementing effective Tier 1 & 2 support movement from “Weak” to “Neutral” in Academic Personalism on the 5 E Survey, and an increase in students attainment and growth on NWEA.

Strategy 2

If we do... Utilize student data and teacher observation data to establish year-long professional learning goals and professional development plans around CIWP Areas of FOCUS (MTSS and Instruction) to be incorporated into Grade Level Meetings;

then we see... Increased teacher capacity for differentiating instruction and implementation of MTSS supports;

which leads to... Increased student growth on NWEA, leading to increased student attainment for priority groups.

Strategy 3

If we do... Focus professional learning in Grade Level Meetings on strengthening Tier 1 instruction to ensure effective use of student data to differentiate instruction and personalize learning;

then we see... Flexible student groupings across the curriculum to personalize learning and differentiate instruction based on student data from a variety of sources and more effective supports for students groups that have traditionally achieved lower levels of growth and grade level attainment;

which leads to... Gains in students growth metrics across attainment levels and increased attainment for priority groups of students.







CPS' District-Wide Support for Vision & Strategies

\$4.6 billion in School Funding, an increase of over \$240 million from last year, plus \$230M from the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER) focuses on the following:

- **Robust classroom instruction**
- **Increased mental health supports and social-emotional learning**
- **Greater access to the arts for a well-rounded education**
- **Expanded professional development and ongoing coaching for teachers**

Specific investments include:

- **\$45 million for teacher professional development**
- **\$72 million to reduce class sizes and minimize split-grade-level classrooms**
- **\$68 million more for special education teachers, classroom assistants, and case managers**
- **\$25 million for Out of School Time (OST) programming for all schools**
- **\$13 million for Mental health supports and trauma-informed interventions**
- **\$10 million to expand pre-K programming**
